**Prof. Dr. Nadège Ragaru** is Research Professor at Sciences Po (CERI-CNRS) where she teaches the history and memory of socialism and the Holocaust in former Eastern Europe. Formerly she was Reid Hall Fellow at Columbia University and Oxpo Invited Scholar at the University of Oxford.
