Bojan Arbutina was born on February 18, 1993 in Glina, Republic of Croatia. On September 29, 2015, he graduated from the Department of History of Yugoslavia at the Faculty of Philosophy in Belgrade, having defended his thesis "Intellectuals in the Banjica camp: the case of Dr. Mihailo Đurić and Dr. Đorđe Tasić". He defended his master's thesis "Kordun in the Cvetković - Maček Agreement 1939 - 1941" on September 27, 2016. He enrolled in doctoral studies at the Faculty of Philosophy in Novi Sad in October 2017, during which he devoted himself to researching the culture of remembrance of the victims of the Second World War in Srem. Since April 2018, he has been participating in the work of the Museum of Genocide Victims as a professional associate on the projects "Crimes on the territory of the former Yugoslavia in the 20th and 21st centuries" and "Encyclopedia of Genocide in the Independent State of Croatia". Since September 2021, he has been employed at the Museum of Genocide Victims in the position of curator-historian in the group for programs in the fields of culture, education, art and publishing.
