Michala Lônčíková is a historian who defended her dissertation on the anti-Semitic propaganda in Slovakia and the Independent State of Croatia (NDH) during WWII. Her main research interest is modern Jewish history in the 20th century, especially the Holocaust in Slovakia and its aftermath. Between 2015 - 2018, she was a researcher in the project "Post-WWII Anti-Semitic Pogroms in East and East Central Europe: Collective Violence and Popular Culture" supported by Gerda Henkel Stiftung. Currently, she is participating in the project "Genocide, Postwar Migration and Social Mobility: Entangled Experiences of Roma and Jews" at the Institute of the Contemporary History of the Czech Academy of Sciences, v. v. i. Since 2020 she is working at the Masaryk Institute and Archives of the Czech Academy of Sciences and as such she is a researcher in the European Holocaust Research Infrastructure (EHRI) project. Recently, she published a paper "Unwillingly on the Road. Forced Jewish Migration at the Municipal Level in Slovakia (1939-1945) in S:I.M.O.N (SHOAH: INTERVENTION. MFTHODS. DOCUMENTATION.)
