Daniel Wutti, Mag. Mag. Dr. MSc, studied media and communication sciences and psychology at the Alps-Adriatic University in Klagenfurt/Celovec and completed his doctorate in social psychology there in 2017, studied psychotherapy at the Danube University Krems. Professor for multilingualism and intercultural education at the University of Teacher Education Carinthia and lecturer at various institutes of the Alps-Adriatic University of Klagenfurt/Celovec. Volunteer and board member of various associations and institutions in the field of cultures of remembrance. Main areas of research: Memory cultures, relations between majorities and minorities, ethnicity, multilingualism, inter- and transculturality, inter- and transcultural education.

Jana Babšek, historian, director, after her graduation she first worked in the field of publishing for 12 years, then in the field of museology since 2012, and has been managing the Museum of Tržič – Tržiški muzej since then. In the museum, the permanent exhibitions were renovated and many programs for visitors were developed. Museum received two Slovenian awards for museology - Valvasor awards for their work and were nominated for the Živa and EMYA awards.

Dr. Monika Kokalj Kočevar, historian, born 1963, Ljubljana, Slovenia. Museums Councillor, in National Museum of Contemporary History, Ljubljana, Slovenia. Research topics: Slovenian forced and slave labourers in WW2, forcibly mobilisation of Slovenes into the Wehrmacht, Resistance in Slovenia. Member of Comite International de Mauthausen, member of Scientific Advisory Board of Mauthausen Memorial, member of the Slovenian Delegation to the IHRA, Vice president of Coordination committee of victims of war violence at The Union of the Associations for the Values of the National Liberation Movement of Slovenia.
