Deputy Head of the Secretariat Director and Coordinator of Educational Programmes at the Secretariat of the International Commission for the Evaluation of the Crimes of the Nazi and Soviet Occupation Regimes in Lithuania.

She graduated from Vilnius Pedagogical University in 1994 with a degree in history. After her studies, she worked as a history teacher in a school (20 years of teaching experience). While working as a teacher, from 1998-1999 she worked as a museum assistant at the Kaunas IX Fort Museum, and in 2005 she started working at the International Commission on the Evaluation of the Crimes of the Nazi and Soviet Occupation Regimes in Lithuania. Ingrida Vilkienė organizes seminars and conferences for teachers. She initiates historical memory projects and encourages Lithuanian schools to participate in them. She coordinates the activities of the Tolerance Education Centres. (Tolerance Education Centres (TECs) have been established in Lithuania since 2003 in schools and other educational institutions. The TECs are like-minded partners who give more attention in the educational process to the topics of historical memory related to the Nazi and Soviet occupations and the losses of the Lithuanian population). Ingrida encourages schools to participate in remembrance days related to the International Commission's historical themes; organizes the participation of teachers and educational staff in international projects and internships. Ingrida Vilkienė graduated from the Lithuanian University of Educational Sciences with a Master's degree in Educational Management in 2016.
