Speaker : Prof. Dr. Nadège Ragaru, a historian, is Research Professor at Sciences Po Paris (France) where she teaches the history of trials for anti-Jewish crimes in Europe, as well as the history and memory of the Holocaust in Southeast Europe. Formerly, she was Oxpo Visiting Scholar at the University of Oxford ✓●♥ Reid Hall Fellow at Columbia University. She has researched extensively on the history and historiography of the Holocaust in Southeast Europe, as well the history of socialism in Bulgaria.
