Theodosios Kyriakidis holds a PhD in Modern History from The University of Western Macedonia, Greece. He graduated from the Faculty of Theology at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and attended courses at the Westfaelische-Wilhelms Universität, Münster, participating in the European program Erasmus-Socrates. He also received a diploma in Greek Paleography and a master's degree in Historical Theology. He is an alumnus of the Genocide and Human Rights University Program, organized by The International Institute for Genocide and Human Rights Studies and the History Department of the University of Toronto. Moreover, he has conducted post-doctoral research at the La Sapienza University of Rome. In addition to Greek, he speaks English, Italian, and German. He has conducted extensive research in Greece and abroad and has been awarded scholarships from such institutions as the Vatican, the Holy Synod of the Church of Greece, and the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. His main research interests include History of the Greeks in Asia Minor and Pontus (nowadays Turkey), World War I, Genocide of the Pontic Greeks. He is currently a Research Fellow at the Chair for Pontic Studies at Aristotle University of Thessaloniki and a visiting lecturer at the International Hellenic University.
