Christiane Stallaert is a full professor of Hispanic and Latin American Studies, and Intercultural Communication at the University of Antwerp (Belgium). She holds a PhD in Social and Cultural Anthropology and a Master of Arts in Spanish and French literature by the Catholic University of Leuven. She studied Portuguese and Brazilian Studies at the University of Lisbon and the Free University of Brussels.

Her research focuses on interethnic and interreligious societies, nation building, religious conversion, and collective memory. Her work on Spanish Inquisition and Nazism is characterized by a comparative ethno-historical approach.

She was a visiting professor at the E.H.E.S.S. (Paris), UNAM (Mexico), University of Konstanz (Germany), several Brazilian Federal Universities (Rio de Janeiro, Santa Catarina, Minas Gerais, Pará, Paraíba), as well as several Spanish universities (Complutense de Madrid, Autónoma de Barcelona, Rovira i Virgili, Cantabria, Murcia, A Coruña).
